Matthew Corrigan Ph.D. is an Associate Professor and chair of the Department of Political Science and Public Administration at the University of North Florida. He is a graduate of University of Notre Dame and received his Masters and PhD from the University of Florida. His research interests include Southern politics and the American Presidency. His book, *Race, Religion and Economic Change* was published this year by University Press of Florida. His second book *American Royalty* was published in May of 2008. *American Royalty* looks at the Bush and Clinton families and their negative impact on American democracy. During the aftermath of the 2000 presidential election, he was a consultant to Duval County, Florida and assisted county leaders in reforming the county's voting system. He has been a two-time President of the Florida Political Science Association. Dr. Corrigan has been quoted in the *New York Times*, *Associated Press*, *The Independent (London)* and dozens of other newspapers around the state and nation. He also has appeared on CNN and NPR and made numerous TV appearances statewide including regular appearances on Channel 4 in Jacksonville.
